May 2024 Church News

The Month of May see two significant campaigns that challenge us to look beyond ourselves. **Christian Aid week** and **Thy Kingdom Come**. It can be quite easy, and understandably so, to become inward focussed when the roof is leaking or the heating no longer works.

Thy Kingdom Come - words we pray regularly in church as part of the prayer Jesus taught his disciples to pray. The Lords prayer is a prayer many know but do we say it or pray it? Saying the words alone are not enough, we need to pray them, and its never too late to start. Thy Kingdom Come is also the name of a global ecumenical call to prayer that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. It started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England. Every person, household and church are encouraged to pray during the 11 days between Ascension the 9th May, and Pentecost on the 19th May, each in their own way. We are invited to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 people we know who have not responded with their 'Yes' to God's call. So who are you going to pray for? If we all prayed for 5 people that could be up to 500 different people being covered in prayer—now wouldn't that be amazing. Looking even further, Christian aid week this year runs from 12th to the 18th May and we are encouraged to pray and raise funds particularly for Burundi. Burundi is one of the poorest countries in the world financially. More than 70% of the population live in poverty. Giving envelopes will be available in church or you are encouraged to donate directly on line.

Perhaps you feel called to do more than pray and donate? Maybe you feel up for **70K in May** Move 70km during May. Walk, run, cycle, however you move is up to you. Invite your friends and family to sponsor you, or even complete the challenge with you! Find out more on the website link found on our back page. Whatever May brings may we lift our eyes and hearts to Gods Glory as we pray Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

We pray for our leaders and members of our government, that they will continue to operate with integrity and in the best interests of the people, especially the vulnerable, disadvantaged and those struggling financially. We continue to give thanks for all NHS and care workers, as they seek to deal with the nation's health needs.

Prayers for the Church: we pray for the work of the Church and its leaders, that the Easter message of hope and salvation would be received worldwide. We pray for Joanne and our Parish of All Souls, for the Annual Meeting on 12 May and those considering election as churchwarden or PCC member, for more volunteers to share the load of looking after our 5 churches.

<u>Prayers for our Community:</u> we pray God's blessing on all who reside or work in our parish and the preparations for all the community events being planned over the summer. We pray especially for all the staff and children in our 3 village schools, that they might end the academic year with a real sense of achievement.

<u>Prayers for the sick:</u> we ask for your loving, comforting and healing presence to be with all who are ill or in pain at this time, especially those of our church family and others known to us, whether at home, in care or in hospital.

<u>Prayers for the bereaved:</u> we pray for all who mourn at this time. Hold them in their grief and comfort them in their sorrow over the loss of a loved one.
