I wonder when you last had a Mars bar? No- I haven't gone 'off piste' this month into advertising! I was thinking about work-life balance –

work and rest—and I had a flashback to the old TV adverts – 'A Mars a day helps you work, rest and play'.

This catchy slogan first appeared in the 1960s, was dropped in 1997 but re-introduced briefly ten years later with a video of monks bellringing!

We all need work, rest and play and getting the balance right is important for our physical and mental health.

None of us can go flat without risking 'burn-out' and none of us can just rest without losing the ability to move and be productive, and if life was just play I'm not sure what we might achieve at all. But many find it difficult to get the balance just right.
